

Have Some Christian Leaders Brought Judgement On Australia?

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There is a lot of talk going around in Australia right now in the Christian community about the judgement of God falling on Australia in the next few years.

We are repeatedly told by various leaders, some “self appointed leaders”, that judgment is coming. Now that may well be true, but I’d like to take a look at the issue from an alternative angle.

Firstly, the bible tells us that man cannot serve God and mammon both. There is a good reason for this – Satan, over the centuries, has often lured man away from God with promises of wealth, power, sexual sin and material goods.

We used to call it the three G’s – girls, gold and glory.

In regard to the gold and glory, if you want to figure out what’s really going on in the world, follow the money trail.

Let me explain what I mean by this. Behind most wars, invasions, corporate takeovers, recessions, depressions and religio/political manouveres we will find that the agenda is inevitably either money or resources. More often than not, it’s a combination of the two.

This is why historical leaders from the four great world empires so far, Babylonian to Roman, have always plundered wealth and resources from the nations they conquered. All of this may seem like stating the obvious, but apparently for some contemporary Christian leaders in Australia it is not obvious at all.

There is most likely a judgement coming on Australia – but let me now share with you part of the reason I believe this to be true.

Anyone who had done their research prior to the second invasion of Iraq on March 20th, 2003, was well aware of the facts surrounding the 'resource situation' in Iraq. Statistics at the time indicated that Iraq may have been sitting on approximately eleven percent of the world oil supply. More recent statistics indicate that the percentage may even be higher. Either way, this is a monumental energy resource in anyone's language.

Now, to be fair, in 2003, Iraq was being led by an awful dictator - that is also a verifiable truth. Leaving aside the fact that this particular dictator was trained and put in place by the CIA, there is still no doubt that he carried out some terrible atrocities at times against his own people. Of course, so had many other dictators around the world during that era – but most of those 'other dictators' were not sitting on a huge chunk of the world oil supply.

So, in 2003, America turned it's attention to Iraq, blaming them for collusion in the 9/11 terror attacks in New York, and also accusing them of harboring weapons of mass destruction.

Of course, the 'weapons of mass deception', as they are now called, have become somewhat of a joke in many circles these days - but if you were a citizen of Iraq in 2003, it was far from a joke. You would have witnessed innocent relatives having their limbs and heads blown off, including little children, and thousands of homes destroyed.

Prior to the invasion there was plenty of good research around regarding the oil resources based in Iraq ; but there was also heaps of good research around regarding the business interests of the ruling American and British politicians at the time. Even soon after the invasion of Iraq, great research books like "Crossing The Rubicon" by Michael Ruppert were being published, exposing the business interests of American ruling politicians and their cohorts in detail.

Just before the invasion, western media had gone to extreme lengths to discredit the chief UN weapons inspector, Hans Blix, who had raised serious doubts about the existance of the WMD's. Back at the time of the initial invasion in 2003, like many others who had done their homework, I smelt a rat. When the first pictures of Australian planes dropping bombs on Iraq appeared in Australian newspapers, I felt physically sick.

There was no doubt, even then, as to what the depth of the destruction would be. Many years later, the John Hopkins University in Maryland did an in-depth statistical study on the fatalities in Iraq since the invasion, and they conservatively estimated 650 to 750 thousand deaths. I am more inclined to believe it was in excess of a million, but even three quarters of a million people dead is horrendous, to say the least.

What does all this have to do with judgement on Australia? Because we, as a nation, actively participated in all this death and destruction, it has quite a bit to do with us ; from God's point of view.

Firstly, let us consider the Latin phrase 'Cui Bono' – in English, this translates to 'Who Benefits'? This is the first question that anybody with a biblical world view should have asked when the Bush administration of 2003 suggested invading Iraq. As I have already indicated, comprehensive research then would have soon revealed the many conflicts of interests that American political leaders had in regard to an invasion of Iraq.

The Bush family were involved in weapons manufacture and the arms trade – all big business if you're planning a war ; and of course, they were also a Texas oil family! Did the whole world have it's blinkers on, or what? Dick Cheney was a major shareholder in Haliburton, the company that 'conveniently' won the contracts to supply all the supplementary goodies for the war effort. Other politicians and advisors on the administration team, such as Donald Rumsfeld, Elliot Abrams, Paul Wolfowitz and Alan Greenspan were all up to their necks in the invasion plot as well.

Due to the business interests that all these politicians, advisors, administrators and their families and friends had in companies that would benefit from this war, they all stood to make a fortune. We're talking billions, not millions, by the way.

Therefore, in regard to Australia's involvement, the first two questions that have to be asked are these –

A] Was John Howard [the then Prime Minister of Australia], just a moronic puppet who went along for the ride?

B] Was he completely unaware of the real agenda?

In my estimation, John Howard was a deviant, arrogant and untrustworthy individual – but he was not a moron, and he was not a puppet. Howard was a well researched and knowledgeable individual, with a comprehensive understanding of the issues and agendas that surrounded Iraq. Both he and his close political team would have been well aware of the real agenda. They were too close to the Whitehouse to have just blindly stumbled along behind America. So close, in fact, that George Bush presented Howard with a US Medal Of Freedom at the end of the whole debacle. Rather ironic really, kill one person and they give you life in prison - kill a million people and they give you a medal.

The conclusion therefore, in regard to Howard and his administration team, is that they knew completely what they were doing. They also knew that hundreds of thousands of innocent people would die in order to secure the desired oil fields.

Accordingly, both Howard and the team that willingly supported him, have participated in mass murder. In fact, they were so keen to carry out this partial genocide, that any Australian citizen at the time who protested in front of Parliament House in Canberra was interrogated by American FBI agents – and asked to give their name and address.

What were FBI agents doing on Australian soil interrogating peaceful Australian citizens involved in an anti-war protest? This was the degree to which John Howard and his team were committed to the mass murder of Iraqis in order to secure the oil resources of Iraq.

So what were the Australian Christian leaders saying during this time? Were they speaking out, explaining the possible consequences to their congregations and standing up for what was right?

No. In fact, many of them were urging their congregations and other listeners to support Howard and his administration – many even claiming that he was a man of God.

The absurdity of this situation bears a striking resemblance to the many Christian leaders in Germany during the early and latter parts of the 1930's who adamantly supported Adolf Hitler, making similar claims that Hitler was 'serving God'. It later turned out that Hitler was, in actuality, a practicing occultist and despot.

The more we study history, the more we see that ‘Christian leaders’ have a long history of supporting cunning megalomaniacs and psychopaths. At least they are consistent, if nothing else.

In Australia, many Christian pastors and leaders persevered with their undying support for John Howard right up until the last election. Some even going so far as to prophecy that it was God’s will Howard be re-elected in a landslide victory. Of course, he wasn’t re-elected, he was annihilated – a sign of God bringing twelve years of deception, destruction and murder to an end.

By the same token, I have no doubt that the current Labor Government in Australia has a definitive globalist agenda – but for the purpose of this article, this is not relevant. What I am trying to achieve in writing this article is to establish the fact that John Howard and his administration participated in a mass murder of the most horrendous scale, and many Australian Christian leaders either supported these actions or turned a blind eye.

This leads us to the question of what is going on in the minds of all these pastors and evangelists that supported the facilitation of oil theft through political deviancy and murder? Are they even Christians at all, and if so, why do so many of them appear to have the discernment of the average house brick?

If a man’s car ran out of petrol, and he walked down the street and murdered a guy mowing a lawn in order to steal a petrol can, there would be Christian leaders in pulpits all over Australia condemning such a despicable act. But when an entire nation participates in what was effectively a mass scale oil theft through murder and destruction – the Christian wolves either loudly support it or remain conspicuously silent.

I refer to the Christian leaders who supported Howard as wolves, because that’s exactly what they were [and still are]. Many of them were in a position at the time to influence the nation in the right direction, but instead they either kept quiet or vigorously instructed the sheep to kiss the butt of the chief wolf.

Some pastors and evangelists were even using pulpits to instruct Australian Christians to vote for John Howard! Thank God by 2007 the Australian Christian people themselves had decided that most of these Christian leaders were morons, and to be ignored. The ballot box proved that.

Personally, I reached a conclusion many years ago that John Howard was not following God, but was just another politician with personal motives and agendas. Therefore, what he did in relation to joining the 'coalition of the greedy', came as no surprise.

What I did find depressing was that so many 'so called' Christian leaders supported him both personally and with his war-related actions overseas. He led our country into a horrific war on false pretenses, and many ministries openly supported it. That was devastating.

So what is the expected end result of all this? The bible teaches us that judgement begins with the house of God, and that's what we can expect.

Many of the same 'Howard supporting' Christian leaders that helped lead the Australian nation into a bloody overseas massacre are still out and about with their microphones, blabbing on about judgement, etc. What I find astounding is that they have failed to realise that, in the eyes of God, they are the ones with blood on their hands.

Consequently, these same leaders have laid the foundation for the judgement of this nation. Yet they remain oblivious to the seriousness of their own actions, and continue to sprout nonsense from pulpits. Someone needs to wave the red flag in front of their faces and say "Yes, there is a judgment coming, and it will start with the house of God, because we have listened to ignorant and biased leaders, and the blood is now on our hands".

The bible also shows us that those who presume to teach will be judged more harshly, and those same preachers should have taken this into account before teaching their people erroneously out of pride and ignorance. Like so many Christian leaders in Germany during the Hitler era, many Australian Christian leaders of the Howard era lacked discernment, failed to do proper research – and their own pride prevented them from hearing the still small voice of God. Of course, not all were like this, but many were.

Unfortunately for Australia as a nation, we must now accept the fact that there is a consequence for dropping bombs on nations who have not attacked us. What we have sown, we must now reap. And if you sow to the wind, you will reap the whirlwind.

Although there are many sins that go on in Australia like abortion and sexual immorality, many of those things are practised by non-believers. Logically, God is far more likely to judge a country on the sin of mass murder supported by those claiming to represent Christ than the sins carried out by the non believers who do not claim any connection to the kingdom of God.

The only hope for Australia, as in the case of Ninevah, is repentance, starting with the Christians. We must repent from the wickedness that was carried out in Iraq under false pretenses, and we should put pressure on the current administration to see that we are not dragged in to any more resource based wars.

Some of those same Christian leaders who supported Australia's involvement in Iraq will argue that God will not judge us, but bless us, for supporting Israel. I realise the Israelites are God's chosen people – but let us be clear – the Iraq war had nothing to do with supporting Israel – it was all about stealing oil. That was the only real agenda, and that is what we will be judged on. Without repentance, this nation is in serious trouble. God will not ignore what has occurred in Iraq, and Australia's participation in those events.

In future, the Australian Christian community must learn to operate in the gift of discernment. Do not take anything that is said over a pulpit at face value, no matter how charismatic the speaker may be.

Whenever there is war, or rumour of war, ask yourself the question 'cui bono'? We must learn to question Christian speakers and leaders ; see if their opinions line up with the facts. At all cost, do not just believe people because they say "God told me". You may be born again, but it does not mean you have to leave your brain on the shelf.

Our nation has committed a lot of cruelty in recent years, in coalition with other nations. In order to move forward we must confess our sins of the past and turn away from them. As for the pharisees who led so many up the garden path? God will hold them to account.
